What is LOGOS?

More than 2,500 churches of all denominations in the U.S. are holding mid-week meetings where young people are finding a new sense of direction, purpose, and dynamic relationships in their local church. The program is LOGOS.

LOGOS is not a substitute or replacement for other programs, but a strong supplement to already existing Christian education programs at First Presbyterian Church.

LOGOS enables our church to offer young people all the dynamics of a good summer camp/retreat on a weekly basis. In the context of a disciplined and structured program, young people enjoy Christian fellowship and growth through creative recreational activities, participation in music and drama, group Bible study and the sharing of dinner.

The program also provides an opportunity to explore one's identity in a Christian environment. Adults serving as leaders help develop genuine and lasting relationships with and among the young people. Not only does LOGOS meet the needs of children; this program is a valuable tool for church family involvement and renewal, as parents and other members of the church are drawn into active participation.

Parent Participation

The LOGOS program enables parents to fulfill a portion of the basic responsibilities set forth for them by God in the rearing of children. Parents are to take an active role in their children's lives and rear them in "the nurture and admonition of the Lord."

Active participation by at least one parent of every child is required. Since the staff is voluntary (except for church staff personnel), volunteer service by a large number of people is essential to keep the many activities going.

Equally important, however, is the "morale boosting" effect of the parents' physical presence and visible support of the program from time to time. This is a vital element of the successful operation of LOGOS.

At registration, either one or both parents will fill out a volunteer sheet indicating how they are willing to participate. Parents are expected to participate a minimum of one hour per week. Parent volunteers can provide this service in three-hour segments or one-hour weekly assignments.
